“ Since being first exposed to Right Bank Bordelaise wines years ago, I have aywals tended to like them more so than examples from the Left. So, over the years I have been fortunate enough to have a couple of great wine merchants near me, and have been able to get wines that are real gems maybe even esoteric, tiny-production, unheard-of wines, but those that are truly good finds. Carillon has been one that I\\'ve returned to repeatedly from the Right. Soils in St Emilion are that wonderful clay-heavy composition where merlot works and tends to ripen a lot. The wines here are round and soft and ripe, ripe, and luscious. But Angelus works magic with Cab Franc, too, in soil with more limestone so a differently-profiled result altogether. Still a lot of extraction and with that cab franc will have chocolate notes. At any rate the grapes Angelus and Carillon use are sun drenched on a southward slope, developing sturdy tannins but full fruit flavor. Divine .!
