Kenneth Lee Geren, 69, of McPherson, Kansas, passed away at 7:02 a.m., Sunday, July 31st, 2016 at McPherson Hospital. Kenny was born in Cherryvale, Kansas on August 1, 1946. After several years of hard work and experience Kenny started his own appliance repair shop, Authorized Service, that later became S&K repair which he ran for 40 years. Kenny was united in marriage to Susan Kay Skelton for 43 years. The young couple established their home together in McPherson and started building their family. Then prior to the high school graduation of the two youngest children the family moved into a historic farm house outside of Inman Kansas. Kenny was very proud of the old farm house and its property, devoting his time to mowing, garden work and tending to his chickens, turkeys and farm dogs Digger, Blue and Bandit. After living in the old farm house for 12 years the structure was preserved and moved to the Inman Museum while the family relocated back to McPherson. Kenny loved his family and was a dear friend to many. He was a generous man who always put others before himself. Kenny will be greatly missed. The memorial service will be held on Wednesday, September 7th, 2016 at 11am at the First United Methodist Church, in McPherson, Kansas, with Reverend Darren Frazier officiating.
